#### Why is the SIP Important?



#### What is the Strategic Implementation Plan (SIP)?

Comprehensive strategic work plan that provides an overarching execution strategy for the balance of priorities in the Atlanta BeltLine program



- 4. 2015 Integrated Action Plan






#### 2005 REDEVELOPMENT PLAN

# The key goals outlined in the Redevelopment Plan include the following:

- The creation of 28,000 units of housing;
  - 5,600 (20%) of these housing units would be set aside as affordable
- The creation of 30,000 permanent jobs;
- The creation of 48,000 one-year construction jobs, and
- A requirement that TAD funded projects pay prevailing wages, support the City of Atlanta First Source hiring system to target residents of low-income Atlanta BeltLine neighborhoods, and utilize pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship programs where available.





### 2013 STRATEGIC IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Built on the 2005 Atlanta BeltLine Redevelopment Plan goals;
- Set out a schedule and strategy for implementation of the Atlanta BeltLine program components;
- Explained the prioritization process behind the schedule of projects;
- Set out options for additional funding and financing of projects;
- Provided an update on community and stakeholder engagement to date and on-going engagement;





2030 STRATEGIC IMPLEMENTATION PLAN



## 2013 STRATEGIC IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Established a framework for ensuring systematic integration of all BeltLine program components;
- Developed a constructive document that suggested project prioritization based on project readiness, equity in development, and development impact;
- Included extensive community engagement to vet prioritization criteria;
- Projected funding that would be available through the TAD and other funding sources; and
- Outlined how the BeltLine infrastructure could be funded over three implementation time periods

### 2015 INTEGRATED ACTION PLAN

- Completed in 2015 and creates an implementation plan for economic development and housing outcomes
- Concentrated on fiscal years 2016 to 2020 and establishes a longer-term general framework for the remaining 10 years of the SIP
- Identified key strategic recommendations:
  - New and increased funding sources
  - Increased capacity for land acquisition and land development control
  - Projects and programs that promote affordable workforce housing and job creation in targeted sectors and BeltLine locations.

#### AFFORDABLE HOUSING WORKING GROUP

Provides framework to achieve goal of creating 5,600 affordable units along BeltLine

#### Identified Eight Recommendations Grouped into Three Key Subcommittees:

- 1. Policy Subcommittee: creates policy recommendations to leverage legislative power for affordable housing initiatives
- 2. Zoning Subcommittee: aligns activities to gain support for Inclusionary Zoning
- 3. Capital Subcommittee: develops capital strategies to support acquisition of funding from various sectors

For-Profit and Non-Profit Developers: Creating and preserving units

GA Department of Community Affairs (DCA): Affordable Housing resources Invest Atlanta (IA): Administers the trust fund and other affordable housing resources

Atlanta BeltLine, Inc. (ABI): Backbone organization responsible for enabling affordable housing within the BeltLine TAD



### SUBAREA MASTER PLANS

- Policy tool to guide future growth and development
- The 10 master plans primarily contain recommendations for future land use, mobility, open space/parks.
- Plans have been developed based on a variety of data, including projections of population and employment growth, economic conditions, travel patterns and behaviors, community input and existing physical constraints and opportunities.
- Plans may be revisited and adjusted, every 5 to 8 years, with appropriate community and technical input.

#### New Policy Initiatives

- Transit IGA with City of Atlanta & MARTA (MORE MARTA Atlanta Program)
- Inclusionary Zoning
- City of Atlanta Affordable Housing Taskforce
- New City of Atlanta Department of Transportation
- Special Service District (SSD) Passage
  - \$100M for Trail Completion (SSD allocation)
  - \$45M for Affordable Housing (TAD allocation)
  - \$12M for Small Business Support (TAD allocation)







## AFFORDABLE HOUSING PRODUCTION

#### 2006-2018:

 1,638 units created or preserved in TAD

#### 2021:


 366 units created or preserved, exceeding goal of 320 units

#### 2022:

- 2022 Goal of 320 units;
  - Actual units: 421 units
  - Exceed goal by 31.5%
- 3,148 units have been created/preserved in the TAD since 2006
- We are 56.2% toward our goal of 5,600 units by 2030

#### 2022 & Beyond:

~310 units annually to meet goal 5,600 unit goal






